Shelton Braeutigam, 77, of Comanche died on Sunday, June 25, 1995, in the Comanche Community Hospital.

Funeral services were held on Tuesday, June 27, at 2:30 p.m., in the Hall and Chaney Funeral Home Chapel with the Reverends Raymond Jones and Gregg Moore officiating. Interment was in the Sipe Springs Cemetery at Sipe Springs.

Braeutigam was born on Feb. 10, 1918 in Fredericksburg, the son of Felix Adolph Braeutigam and Elsie Francis Herbort Braeutigam. He married Neoma Wallace on Nov. 13, 1960 in the Stag Creek community near Comanche.

Braeutigam was a retired heavy equipment operator and had worked for highway contractors for many years. He retired in 1983.

Fredericksburg How did it get its name?

When Fredericksburg was founded in 1846 the spelling of the town Friedrichsburg. It was name in honor of Prince Frederick of Prussia. His full name was Friedrich Wilhelm Ludwig of the House of Hohenzollern (Franconian name). He was born Octover 30, 1794, took part in the wars of liberation from Napoleon in 1813-1815, and then lived in Dusseldorf as a general of that cavalry until 1848. He was married in 1817 to Prinzessin Wlhelmina Luise van Anhalt-Bernburg (1799-1882), Prince Frederick died July 27, 1863, leaving his wife and two sons.

A copy of a lithograph of Prinz Frederick is on display in the Milam Hall of the Pioneer Memorial Library in Fredericksburg.
